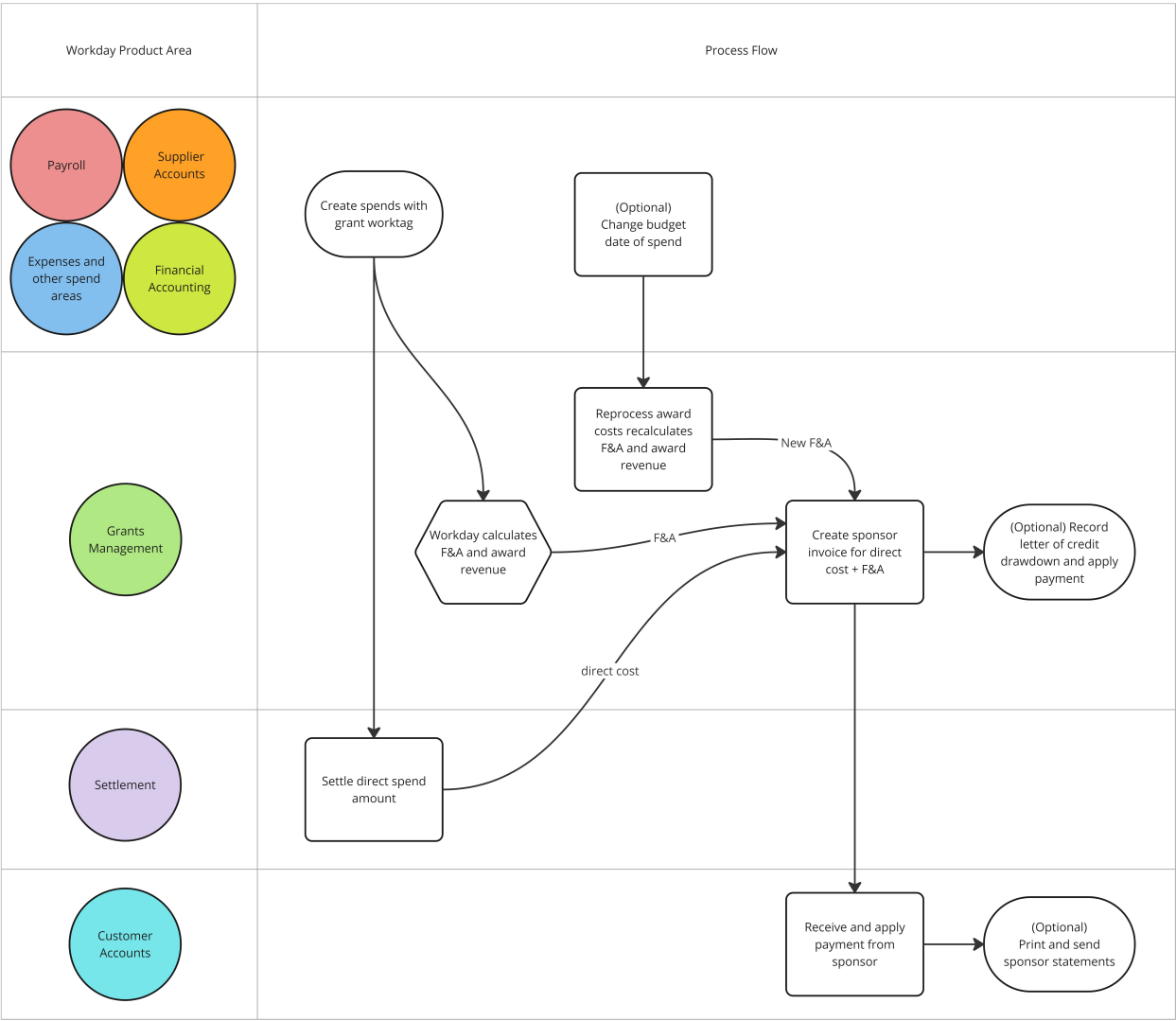

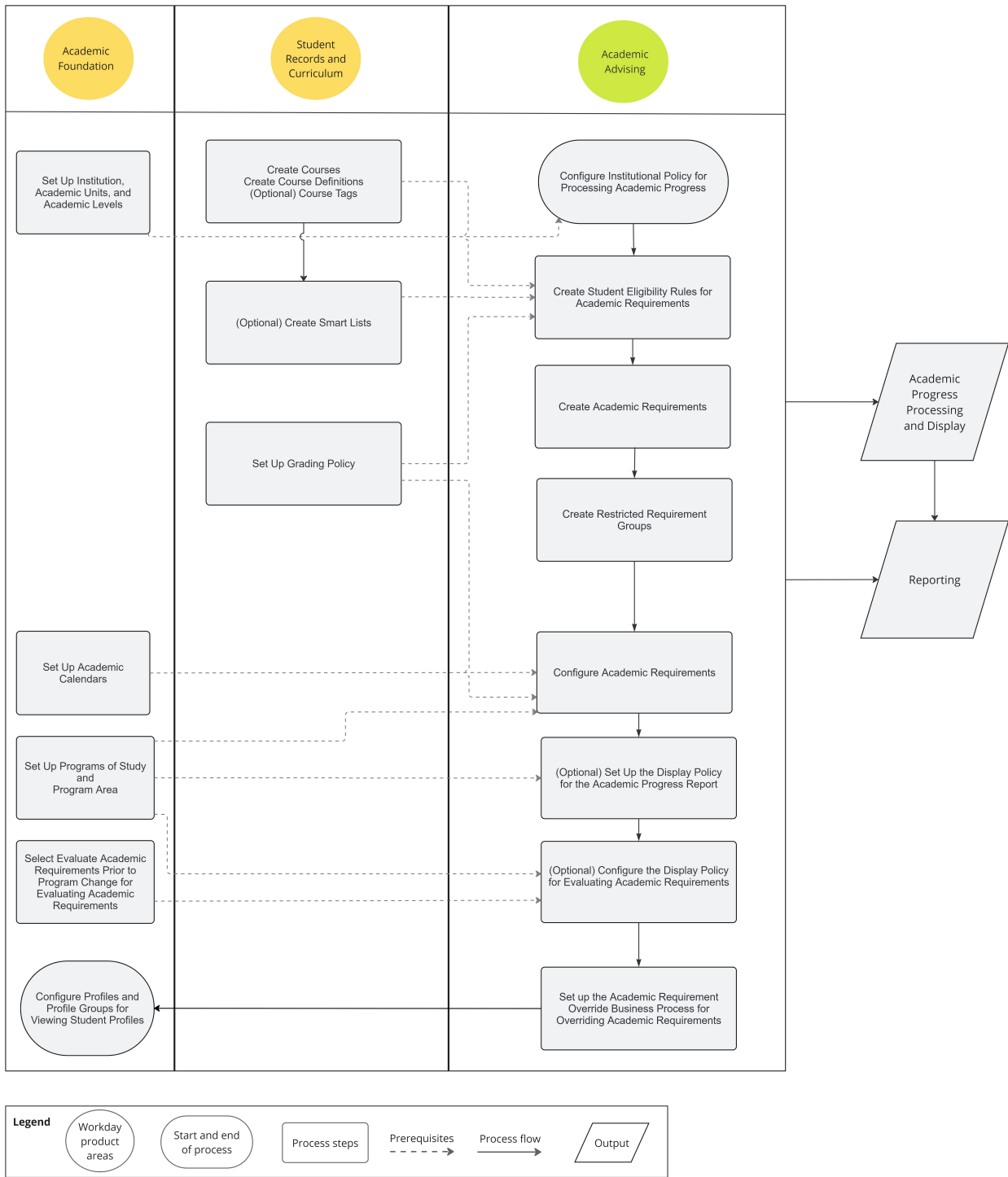

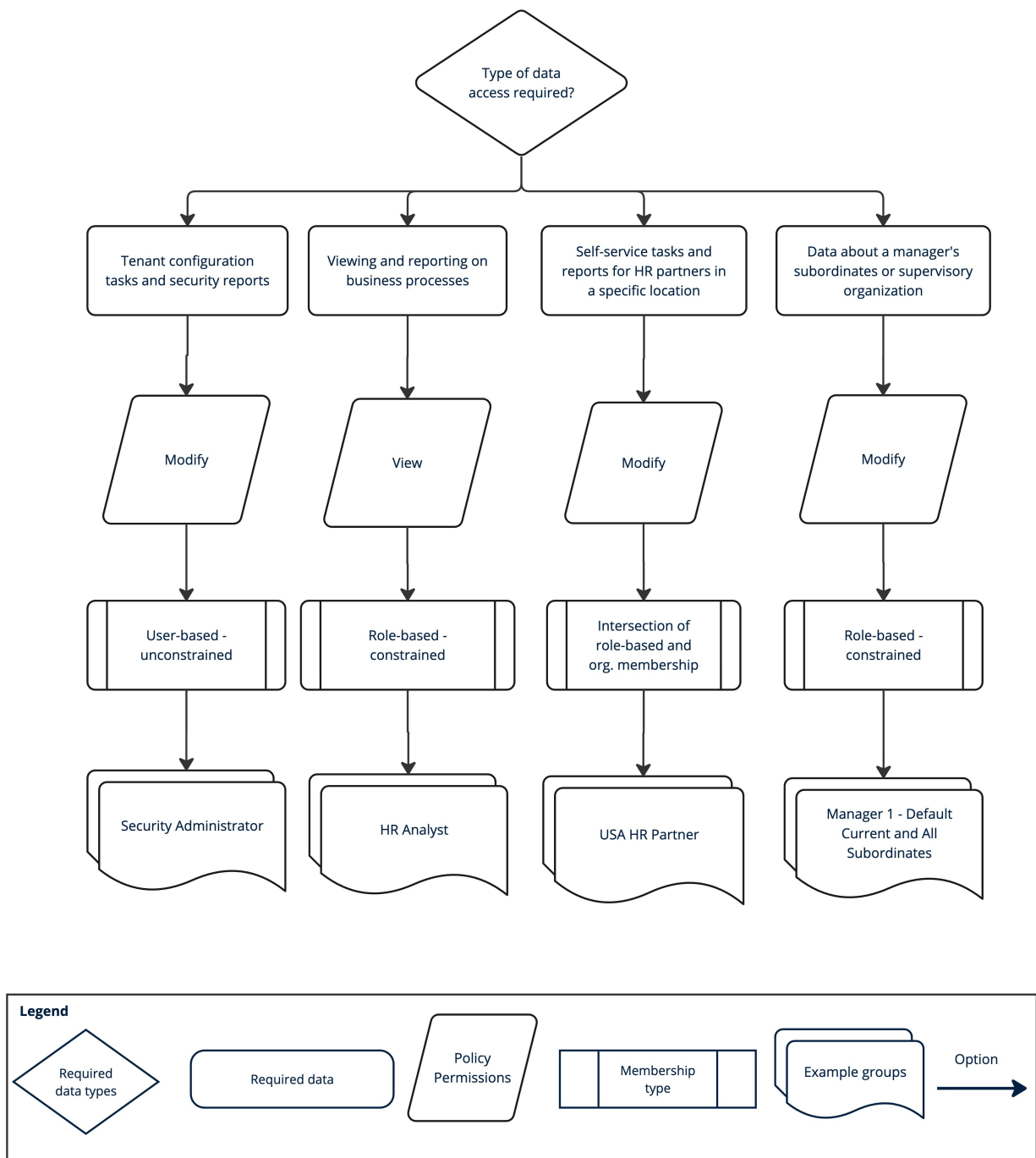
Overview

You can organize security groups around shared characteristics like user types, roles, organizations, and other factors. You then use security policies to grant those groups access to domains and business processes, which secure and organize various items, including tasks, data sources, reports, and business process steps. At the highest level, domains and business processes are organized by functional area.

While you can edit domain or business process security policies to assign different groups and change their item access, many domains only allow specific groups to be secured to related policies.

Before you create a security group, consider the type of data you want the underlying group to access and any related constraints on permissions. These factors can shape which type of group you select.

This use case provides an example of how to decide which security group meets your business needs. While your process might look different from the one outlined here, this use case offers guidance for security group selection and configuration.

When you get a request to create a report, review the report requirements, but before creating a new report from scratch, follow these guidelines in the order listed below:

1. Search for a similar report in your tenant.
2. If you can't find the report in your tenant, look for a similar report in the WDSsetup tenant by browsing the available packages in the Configuration Catalog.
3. When you don't find a similar report in any tenant, create the new report.

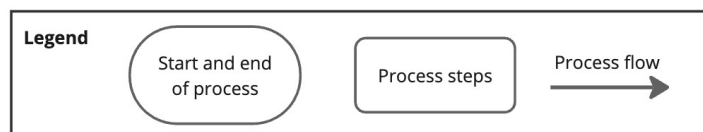
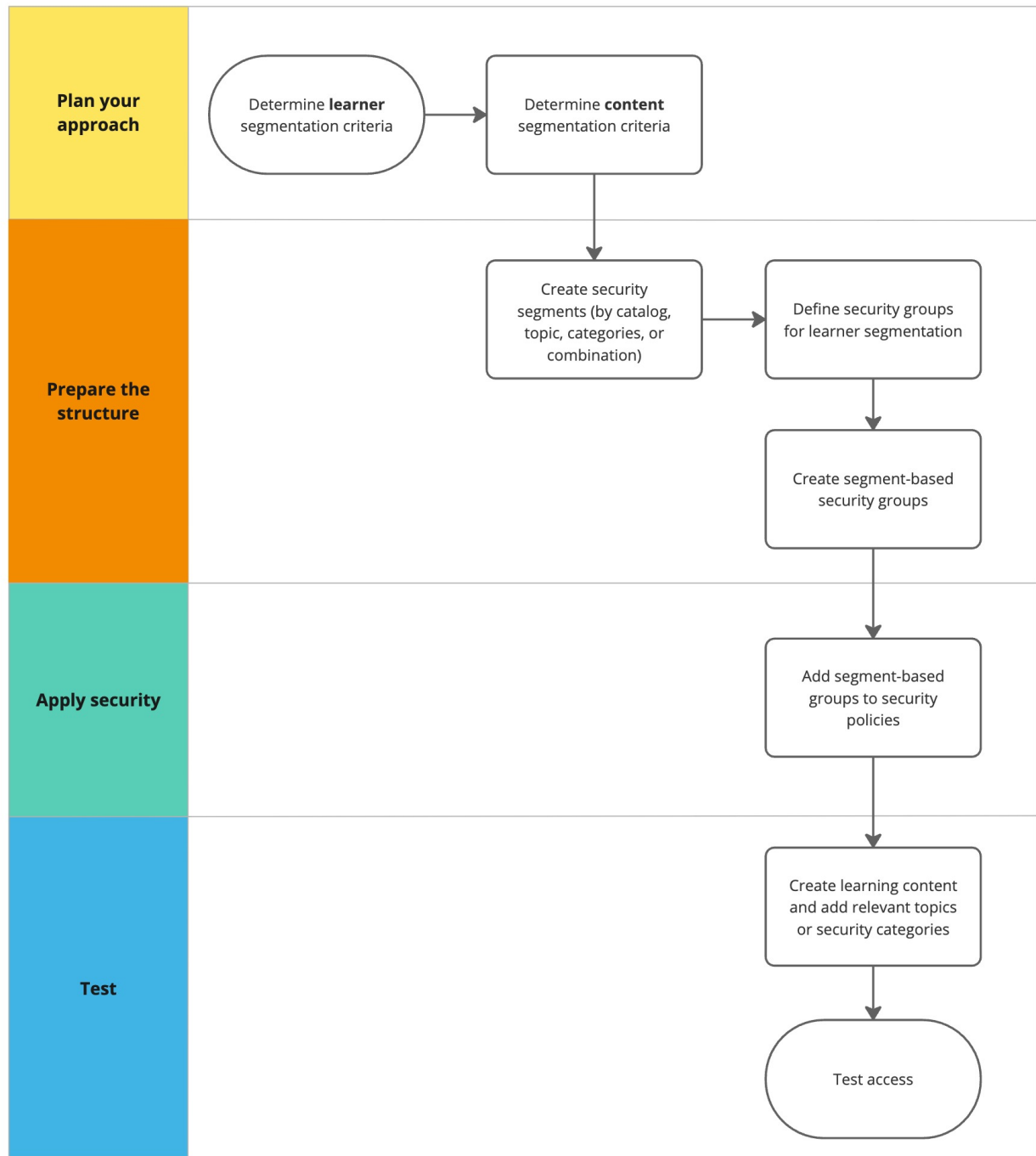

Overview

Learning Security Segments help you control access to learning content based on specific criteria. This use case provides an example of the process flow and the area in Workday where you carry out each step. Your process might consist of different tasks or workflows.



Security Considerations

- Workday Learning content uses security categories, topics, and catalogs to provide granular control.
 - When you assign a security category to a course or program, the associated security group determines user access. Applying a security category to a course makes it the primary security method, overriding any topic or catalog-level security settings.
 - Learning topics receive security segments from their assigned catalogs by default. However, if a topic defines its own security segments, these will always take precedence.
- When you have a large number of segment-based security groups with common access requirements, you can create aggregation security groups that include the segment-based security groups and assign permissions to the aggregation security group instead. 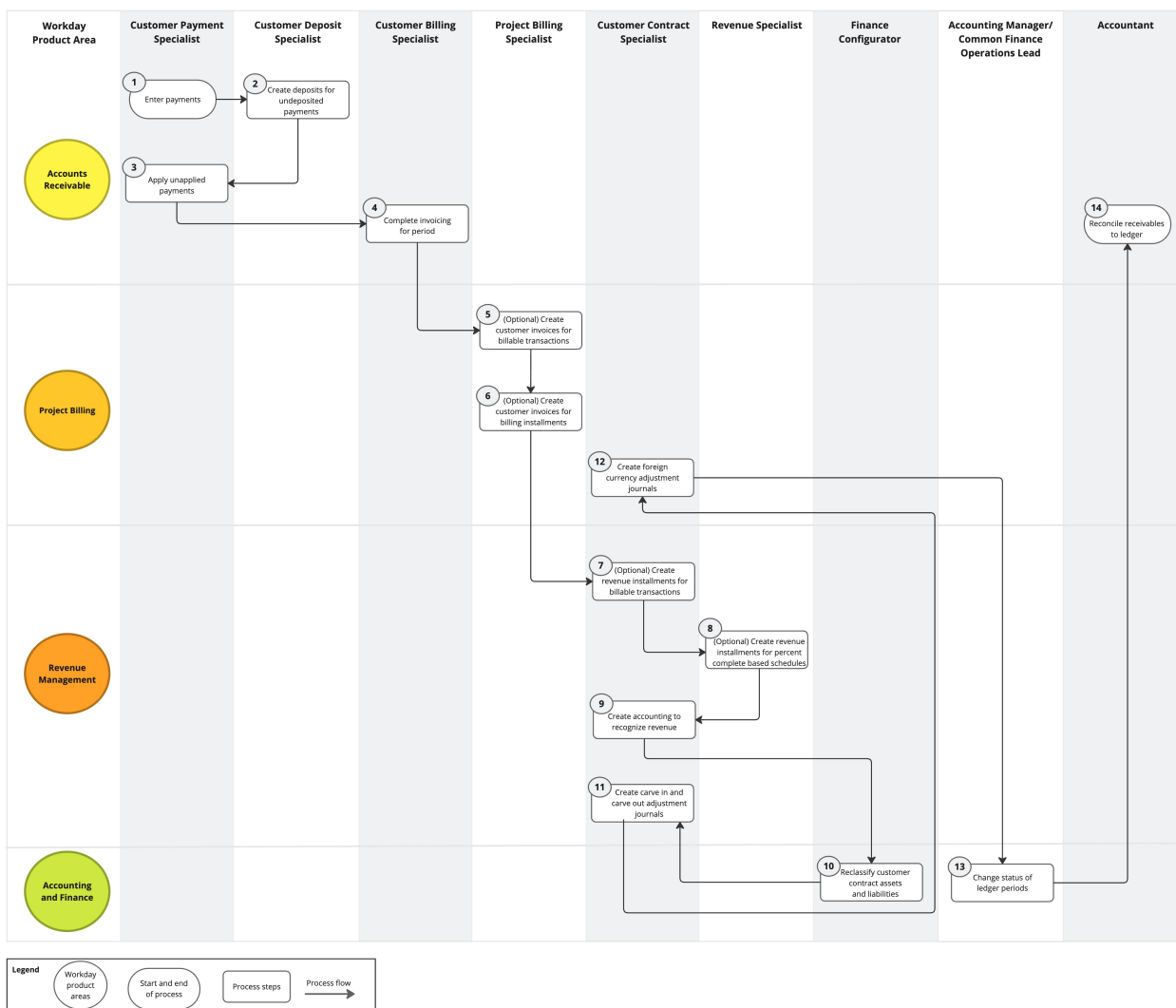

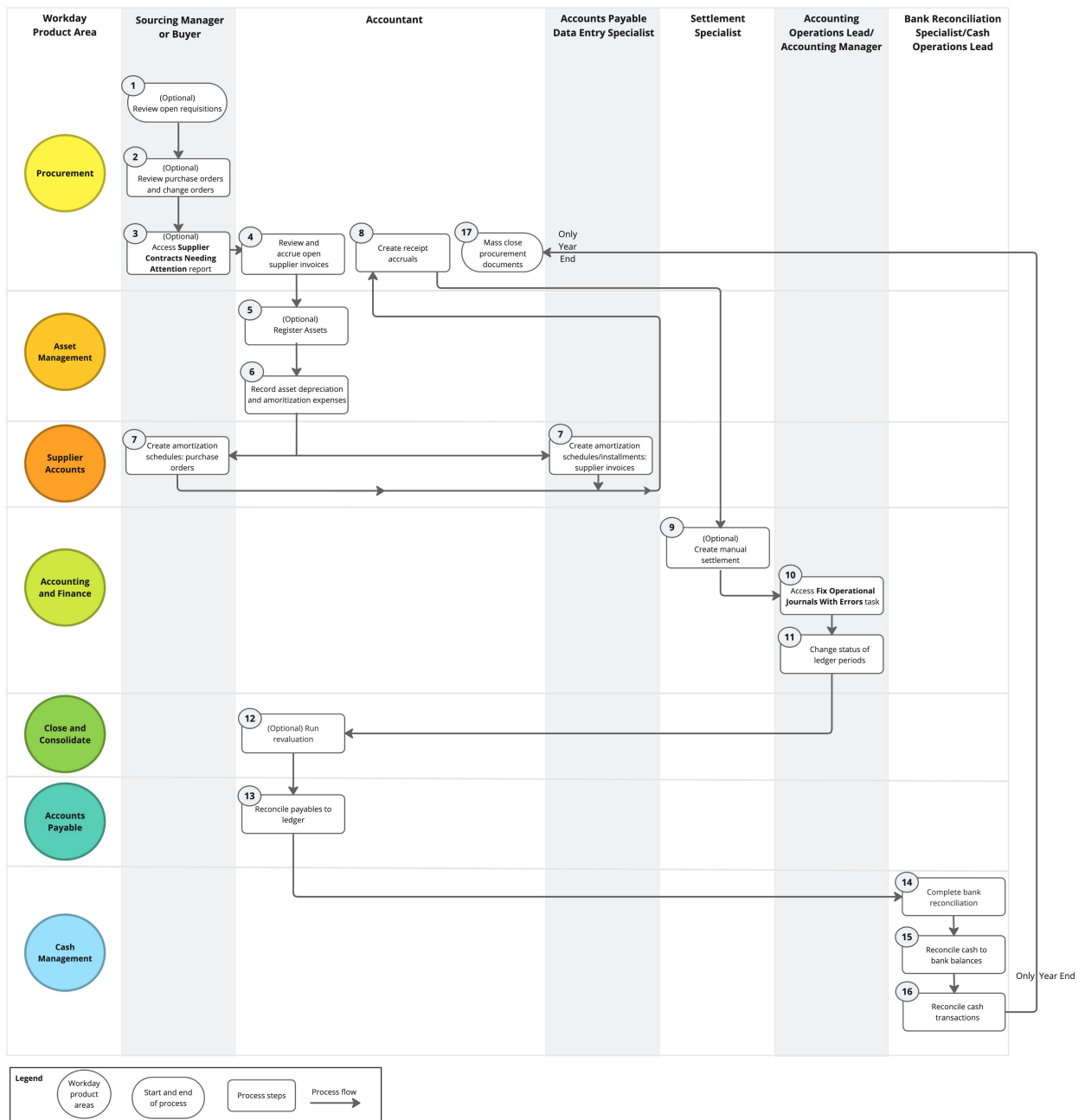

Use Case: Reporting Tools in Workday

Your organization might use different names for these roles.

Overview

In this use case, we discuss the properties of different reporting tools available in Workday that you can use to create reports. Understanding their unique properties is key to selecting the ideal tool for your data analysis and decision-making.

OfficeConnect

You can use OfficeConnect if you primarily work with financial data in Microsoft Excel for ad-hoc queries, financial statements, or planning data.

- **Description:** An Excel add-in that securely connects to curated Workday financial data or Adaptive Planning data.
- **Who uses it:** Accountants, FP&A professionals, and financial analysts who may have limited Workday knowledge.
- **Use Cases:** Generating financial statements, performing ad-hoc financial analysis, and daily reporting.
- **Important Considerations:**
 - Accessed only through Excel, not directly in Workday.
 - Supports modeled data sources like Journal Lines and Plan Lines for Financial Reporting, plus Adaptive Planning.
 - Integrates external data directly into the Excel file.
 - Features a security option to clear data on save, requiring users to sign in and refresh for current data.

Discovery Boards

You can use Discovery Boards if you want to use self-service ad-hoc analysis with an interactive, visual interface to uncover trends and insights.

- **Description:** Visual data analysis tools embedded in Workday with a drag-and-drop interface.
- **Who uses it:** Typically created by centralized report developers and analysts, and consumed by analysts, managers, and executives for quick insights.
- **Use Cases:** Visual analysis across these domains:
 - HCM: Identifying skills gaps, setting benchmarks, evaluating training.
 - Financials: Expense analysis, understanding past-due receivables, analyzing DSO drivers.
- **Important Considerations:**
 - Supports most indexed Workday-delivered data sources and all Prism data sources.
 - Uses Workday's Drive sharing model with Can View or Can Edit permissions.
 - Can access through Workday search, Drive, or direct URL.
 - Displays data based on the user's security permissions.

Worksheets

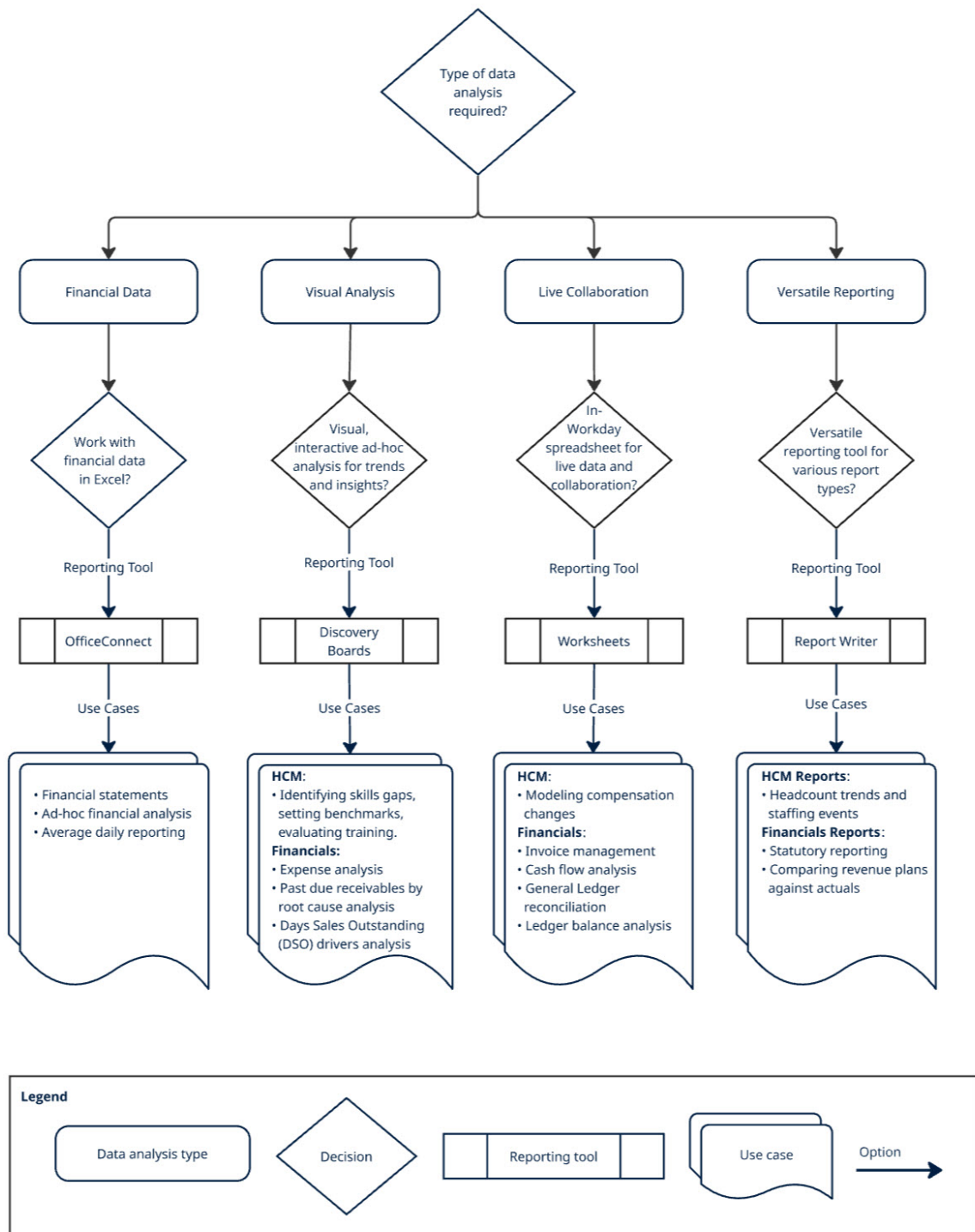
You can use Worksheets, when you need a spreadsheet-like environment within Workday to collaborate and work with live, secure data, and model changes.

- **Description:** A spreadsheet tool directly within Workday for interacting with live data and facilitating organization-wide collaboration.
- **Who uses it:** Generally created by centralized report developers and analysts, and consumed by analysts, employees, and managers.
- **Use Cases:** Real-time data modeling and collaborative data manipulation for:
 - HCM: Modeling compensation changes.
 - Financials: Invoice management, cash flow analysis, general ledger reconciliation, ledger balance analysis.
- **Important Considerations:**
 - Connects to Workday data through advanced, matrix, and composite reports.
 - Uses the Drive sharing model with Can View, Can Comment, or Can Edit permissions.
 - While initial data import and refresh respect user security, all users with access to the workbook can view all data within it unless Workbook Templates are used to maintain contextual security.
 - Can include external data.
 - Accessible via Workday search, Drive, or direct URL.

Report Writer

If none of the above specific needs apply, and you require a versatile, general-purpose reporting tool for various report types, scheduling, or integrations, you can use Report Writer as the foundational solution.

- **Description:** The original Workday reporting tool, handling a wide range of reporting use cases, including tabular and summarized data.
- **Who uses it:** Reports are typically created by centralized report writers and consumed by a broad audience, including analysts, employees, managers, business leaders, HR, and finance professionals.
- **Use Cases:** Highly versatile across these domains:
 - HCM: Headcount trends, staffing events.
 - Financials: Statutory reporting, comparing revenue plans vs. actuals.
- **Important Considerations:**
 - Supports all Workday-delivered report data sources (RDSs), including Prism and business view data sources.
 - Allows inclusion of fields from related business objects on Advanced reports.
 - Supports calculated fields on all report types.
 - External data only with a Prism Analytics subscription.
 - Reports can be scheduled for delivery.
 - Supports downstream business processes (embedded analytics) and integrations (report-as-a-service, RaaS).
 - Data displayed respects the user's contextual security.

Overview

On-behalf intercompany transactions enable you to process payments and invoices in place of the company that provides the goods and services. When you configure your intercompany profiles and relationships, you can record, initiate, and settle on-behalf intercompany activities. This use case outlines different tasks and user roles involved in the process of setting up on-behalf intercompany transactions. This use case provides an example of the process flow and the areas in Workday where you carry out each step. Your process might consist of different tasks or workflows.
